## About Mary Floyd Cushman, MD

Mary Floyd Cushman (1870-1965) graduated from the Eastern Maine Normal School in Castine (now the Maine Maritime Academy) in 1888 and from the Boston University School of Medicine in 1892. She embarked on a general practice of medicine in Farmington and while there became the first woman member of the Maine State Medical Board.

In 1922 Dr. Cushman closed her medical practice and moved to Angola, West Africa as a medical missionary. "Doctor Mary," as she was known, established a hospital and clinic in Ocileso, and served the outlying areas inhabited by the Bantu people of the Umbundu tribe. Her staff consisted only of indigenous people she had personally trained. Over the next 30 years she periodically returned to the U.S. for fundraising to continue her work. Dr. Cushman left Angola for the U.S. in 1953 at the age of 83.

Dr. Cushman was the very prototype of a dedicated medical missionary, and wrote a book about her work titled <u>Missionary Doctor</u>: <u>The Story of Twenty Years in Africa</u>, published by Harper & Brothers in 1944.

## Nominations

The Maine Medical Association presents the Mary F. Cushman Award each year to recognize the humanitarian service of Maine medical volunteers who serve many hours - in Maine, throughout the United States, or abroad - to help the less fortunate of humanity. The award is announced at the Association's Annual Session, and includes a \$1,000 donation to the institution or organization of the recipient's choice.

Priority consideration is given to:

- the nomination of a Maine physician who is a member of the Maine Medical Association.
- nominations submitted by members of the Maine Medical Association.
- nominations that, for international volunteering, include training people in other countries to provide care in their own communities.

Nominations for the 2019 award are due by July 31, and should describe the volunteer's activities and contributions to the profession.
