

Joint Providership Statement

This statement needs to be included on all literature intended for learners (e.g, brochures, handouts, slideshows, evaluation forms, etc.), with the exception of initial, save-the-date type of announcements. The statement may be in small font and included in footer sections as necessary. **Be sure to replace the [name of the nonaccredited provider] with the name of the organization applying for CME approval. **This statement must appear on the brochure/agenda, evaluation form, and certificate submitted for activity approval.****

Statement:

This activity has been planned and implemented in accordance with the accreditation requirements and policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the joint providership of the Maine Medical Education Trust and [name of nonaccredited provider]. The Maine Medical Education Trust is accredited by the Maine Medical Association Committee on Continuing Medical Education and Accreditation to provide continuing medical education for physicians.

AMA Credit Designation Statement

*CME **cannot** be mentioned on any materials distributed to learners until the activity has been approved.

After approval, this statement should be included in italics on all marketing materials (e.g., brochures) and certificates intended for learners when referring to CME.

Please submit a brochure/agenda and certificate for approval that contains this statement, but you may not distribute that material with this statement for learners until approval has been awarded. You may distribute materials to learners without this statement. **Be sure to replace [activity type] with live activity or enduring material as applicable and [number of credits] with the number of credit hours intended to be awarded to learners.**

Promotional materials may not make reference to CME without prior activity approval. For instance, do **not** state “CME credit applied for,” or similar wording since this is contrary to AMA/ACCME/MMET policy. If such wording is included, MMET reserves the right to rescind any CME approval.

Statement:

Opioid Prescribing Education Statement

Follow the same use criteria for the Opioid Prescribing Education Statement as for the AMA Credit Designation Statement.

If the activity offered includes a presentation on opioids, chronic pain, or opioid addiction, or prescribing, it may be approved for Opioid Prescribing Education CME. **If approved, use the following statement on all advertising materials and the CME Documentation form. Non-Physician Participant Statement

AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™ can only be awarded to MDs and DOs, but if a non-physician attendee would like to claim the hours they participated in the activity, they can be awarded a Certificate of Participation.

To award this certificate, the name of the participant and the amount of time they participated in the activity must be known. The certificate will need to be issued on an individual basis. In place of the AMA Credit Designation Statement, their certificate should contain the statement below. Be sure to replace each category with the corresponding information.
