MOC Overview

MOC stands for Maintenance of Certification.

Currently the ACCME collaborates with 6 Specialty Boards.

This collaboration allows Accredited CME Providers to report

MOC credits earned by physicians.

Accredited CME

ABA; ABPath; ABS; ABOS

- Must meet CME Requirements
- Activity is relevant to learners certified by the specialty board

Accredited CME with Evaluation and Feedback

ABIM; ABOHNS; ABS; ABP; ABOS

- Must meet CME Requirements
- Includes an evaluation component with a "participation threshold"
- Provides feedback to learners

Accredited CME Improvement Activity

ABIM; ABOHNS; ABPath

- Must meet CME Requirements
- Addresses a quality or safety gap
- Has specific, measurable aims for improvement
 - Assesses impact of interventions

Accredited
Patient Safety
CME

ABA; ABIM; ABOHNS

- Must meet CME requirements
- Addresses foundational safety knowledge and/or prevention of adverse events
- Must be offered in conjunction with another MOC Activity Type

American Board of Surgery Changes

Effective July 1, 2023

ACCME Announcement – February 3, 2023

ABS RETIRES SELF-REPORTING OF CME CREDITS: ANSWERING YOUR QUESTIONS

The American Board of Surgery (ABS) <u>recently announced changes</u> in how their diplomates can receive Continuous Certification (CC, also known as MOC credit) for participating in CME activities. Effective July 1, 2023, ABS is discontinuing self-reporting of credits by diplomates. For an ABS surgeon to have their CME credit count toward their ABS CC requirements, it will need to come through PARS. Since ABS accepts any accredited CME relevant to surgery, many providers will have CME activities that would count. If any of your surgeon-learners would like you to report their CME credit, you can register the activity in PARS and report their credit. It will then be made available to ABS and show up in the surgeon's ABS profile.

Since <u>ABS joined the CME for MOC Collaboration in 2021</u>, all accredited providers have been able to register their CME activities for ABS CC and report their surgeon learners' credit in PARS. Over 150 accredited providers have registered their activities for ABS. There has been no change to require accredited providers to report credit for any of the certifying boards. Participating in the CME for MOC Collaboration remains an optional way for accredited providers to add value to their CME programs and relieve some of the reporting burden from physician learners.

Changes for MOC Credit Reporting

Old System

Physicians submitted certificates to the American Board of Surgery to self-report MOC Credits earned.

AND/OR

Accredited Providers reported ABS MOC credits earned by physicians in PARS.
The ABS could then access this information.

New System

Physicians are no longer able to self-report ABS MOC credits to the specialty board.

SO

Accredited Providers must report ABS MOC credits for physicians in PARS.

(If they choose to report these credits for their learners)



Consent Form

Best for use with a repeated group of learners

What is CME Passport?

A free, centralized web application where physicians can create a personalized account to view, track, and generate transcripts of their reported CME credit and search for CME Activities. Physicians can create accounts at https://www.cmepassport.org/.

Who's Behind the Change?

The Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) has partnered with all state medical and osteopathic licensing boards and certain specialty boards to move towards a centralized CME and MOC reporting and tracking system. This system allows state boards to obtain CME records and for select specialty boards to obtain MOC records.

Physicians who wish to take advantage of this free tracking and reporting system must grant permission to the Maine Medical Education Trust to report earned credits on their behalf.

Evaluation

Best for use with a changing group of physicians.

Ask for the necessary information on the evaluation form learners complete at the end of each relevant activity.






Step 3: Choose a Certifying Board from the Drop-Down Menu






Step 4: Choose Practice Areas Relevant to Activity



Note: This screen appears AFTER the usual final screen when creating an activity.


Step 5: Indicate the Credit Type

Step 7: Indicate the Last Day Learners Can Claim MOC Credit

Some Specialty Boards have requirements about when they want their learner credit reported.

What is the last day a learner can claim MOC credit?

MOC CREDIT DEADLINE

The state of the stat

ABS – Up to 5 years after completion

ABP – No later than December 1st of current calendar year, but wants learners reported within 30 days.

Others are up to the provider.



Step 8: Attest that the Program Follows MOC Requirements and Allow ACCME to Access and Publish Information

Program Attestation




After the activity, MOC credits can be reported on an individual basis or batch uploaded.

1. To Add Individual Learners, click on the activity



2. Enter Learner Information


Note: MOC can be reported without reporting the CME.



3. Click Add a Certifying Board

+ Add a Certifying Board or Collaboration

4. Choose a Board from the Drop-Down Menu



Only Boards associated with the activity will appear.

5. Enter Board ID and Credits



These numbers will be the same if there is only one credit type.

The system will let you know if the learner is matched (found in the system) or not matched.

Credits can only be reported when they are matched.



When Learner is matched:

Submit and Add Another Learner

Submit and Close

When Learner is not matched:

Learner Not Matched

Look up Learner on Specialty Board site

Contact Learner to make sure information is correct

Ask if they have had any former names
